

About the Webinar

There has been a significant development in the area of phonetic and phonological research in the twenty-first century. The advancement of technology and mass communication has revolutionized the fields of phonetics and phonology. The forensic application of phonetic sciences is a relatively recent development which when applied to legal cases helps them in the identification of the culprits. It is indeed a known fact that different speakers can have different formant resonances which help us in identifying the speaker by analyzing their speech. At the same time, it is also mandatory to know the normalization techniques in order to filter out physiological differences among speakers and to preserve dialectal/ cross-linguistic differences in vowel quality. Knowledge of speaker identification and vowel normalization techniques is the need of the hour. Furthermore, optimality theory, since its inception in 1993, is still in vogue as it is the much-loved theory of the phonologists because of its applicability in various phonological problems in most of the world languages. This webinar focuses on some of these key areas in phonetic and phonological research and aims to impart more knowledge on the same.
